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WHAT'S IN YOUR BACKPACK?

This may be in the form of attention issues, poor organization, sensory difficulties, learning disabilities, or behavior challenges. We want to make sure you have the necessary tools to help them succeed. Here are a few tips to help you get started:

GET INFORMATION!

Advocacy begins with being informed. The resources featured in this newsletter should help you get started down the right path.

GET ORGANIZED!

Once you have direction, you will need to organize information about your child in a way that makes sense to you as well as their educators. Don't be afraid to ask for help or get feedback from others.

GET MOVING!

OK2SAY is a student safety program that uses a comprehensive communication system to facilitate tip sharing among students, parents, school personnel, community mental health service programs, the Department of Human Services, and law enforcement officials about harmful behaviors that threaten to disrupt the learning environment. 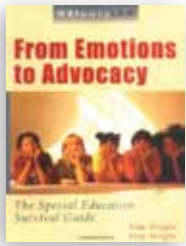

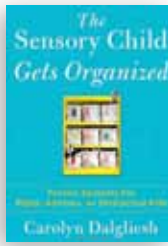


Wrightslaw: From Emotions to Advocacy: The Special Education Survival Guide
